NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES ANNOUNCES NEW GRANT OPPORTUNITY FOR LOCAL NEIGHBORHOOD ORGANIZATIONS



The City o f St. Neighborhood Services is offering a Neighborhood Grant Program (NGP) which provides grant funding of up to \$3,000 to formally and informally organized groups that undertake small-scale neighborhood improvement, enrichment, and enhancement projects or events within the City limits.

NGP funds accompanied with City

Staff's technical assistance, are designed to empower neighborhood organizations to effectively plan and implement neighborhood and community initiatives.

"This is an exciting opportunity for the City to invest in our neighborhoods and its stakeholders. The Neighborhood Grant Program empowers residents, encouraging them to take ownership in their own initiatives" said Jaime D. Perkins, Neighborhood Services and CRA Manager. "I am excited to offer support for the projects and programs that residents will develop."

Applications can be submitted the 1st through the 15th of January, April, July and October each year to the City of St. Augustine Neighborhood Services and CRA Division via email at NGP@CityStAug.com, by mail or in person at City of St. Augustine Neighborhood Services Division, 75 King Street, Lobby B, 4th Floor, St. Augustine, FL 32084.

Once your application has been reviewed and determined to meet the guidelines, it will be reviewed by the Neighborhood Grant Program Award Committee (NGPAC).

Project Update: Eddie Vickers Park Sports Courts

The CRA has signed the contract for the sports court project at Eddie Vickers Park! The contractor awarded the Eddie Vickers Sports Court Improvement Project is the El Ford Crown LLC dbe Court Surfaces. The



Faro Group, LLC dba Court Surfaces. The project is expected to be completed by this fall with the total contract cost at just under the



\$420k estimated cost. The project is partially funded using AARPA funds contributed by the St. Johns County Parks and Recs Department. The courts will be upgraded to two full size basketball courts and six pickleball courts. The sports court improvement is just one element of the Vickers/Hayling park multi-phase recreational improvements. For more information go to CityStAugCRA.com.

Street Sweeping

The City's Elgin street sweepers run 7 days a week collecting 50-70 yards of vegetative debris per week that is used as mulch and other environmentally friendly projects. You can help by moving parked cars off the street when




roadway signage is out for sweeping in your area. Residents can anticipate neighborhoods being swept 3-4 times annually. Interruptions in the schedule may be caused by a heavy storm season, hazardous incidents and general equipment maintenance. To comply with the Clean Water Act it is important for residents to blow debris back onto personal property, bag loose debris and focus on keeping debris out of the storm drains.



Did You Know? The Solid Waste Recycling Coordinator donates the old street sweeper brooms to the mid-west where farmers use them as cattle scratchers and boot brushes!
